3. Avoid fuel issues

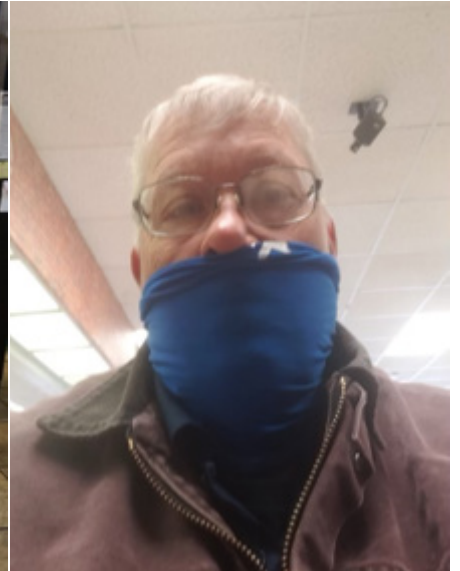

Safety Action of the Week – Carbon Monoxide

With the lack of power in the Texas the past week. Many residents have turned to other forms of heat. Some of these sources, like BBQ grills, gas stoves, and propane heaters will emit carbon monoxide into your home. I recently read an article about a Texas family who was using their gas grill to heat their it. All 6 family members were admitted to the hospital with CO poisoning.

Carbon Monoxide (CO) is an odorless, colorless gas that can kill you.

The most common symptoms of Carbon Monoxide poisoning are headache, dizziness, weakness, upset stomach, vomiting, chest pain, and confusion. If you have been around a gas heat source and are experiencing these systems, please seek immediate medical attention.

To prevent CO poisoning in your home:

- Install a battery-operated or battery back-up CO detector in your home
- Have your heating system, water heater, and any other gas burning appliances serviced by a qualified technician every year
- Make sure your gas appliances are vented properly
- Never use a gas range or oven for heating
- Never burn charcoal indoors. Burning charcoal gives off CO.
- Never use a portable gas camp stove indoors
- Never use a generator inside your home, basement, or garage or less than 20 feet from any window, door, or vent

Stay safe. Stay covered. Stay clean.

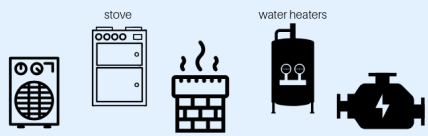
