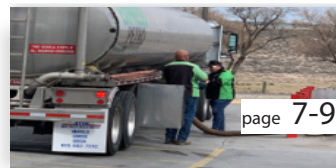

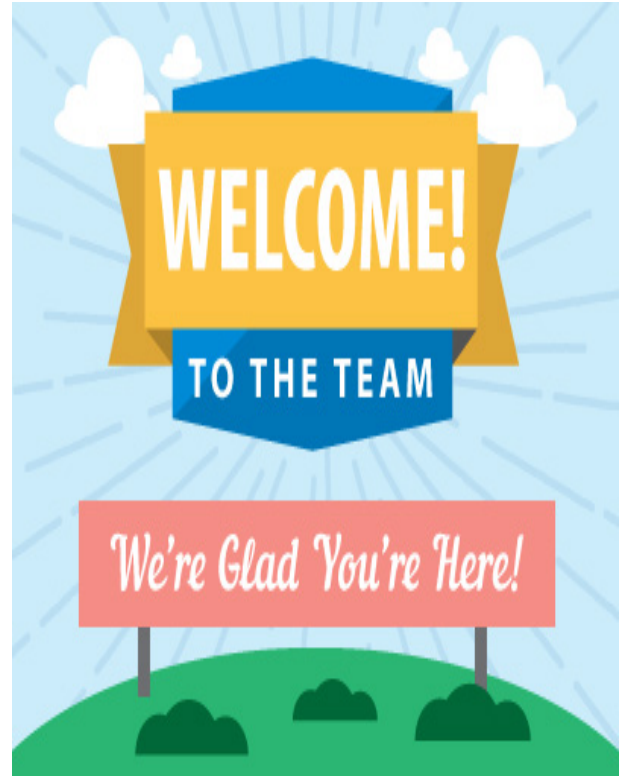

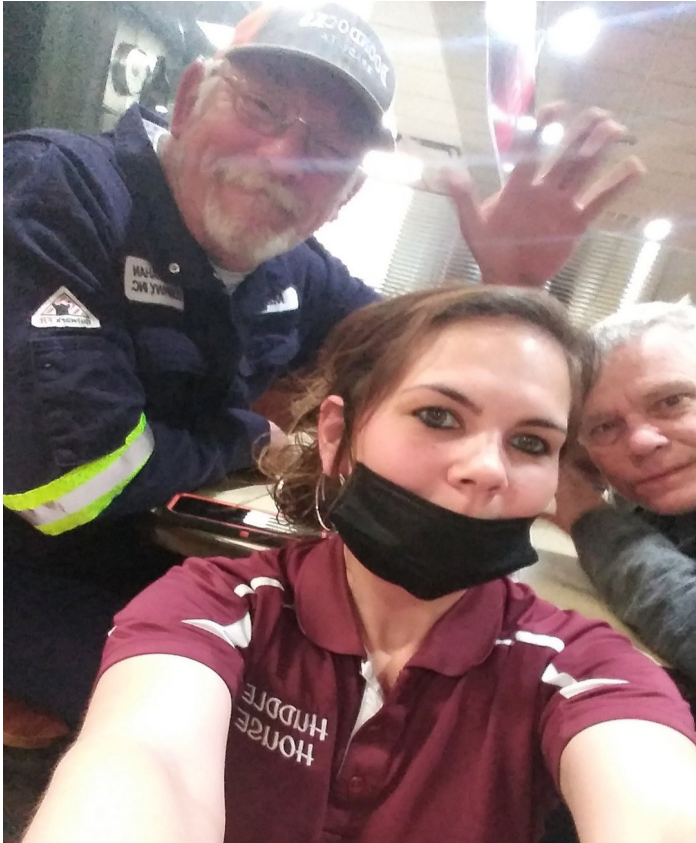


Say hello to Brittany! She is our newest Team Member of our shift Lead Team at Huddle House 930!

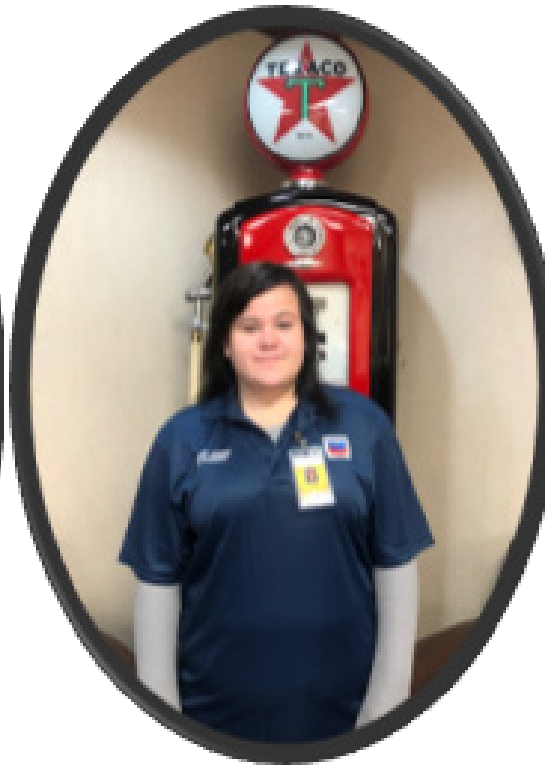

Alma, Kwik Eats Manager at store 316, was in New Hire class two years ago. Wow, time flies when you're having fun!!!

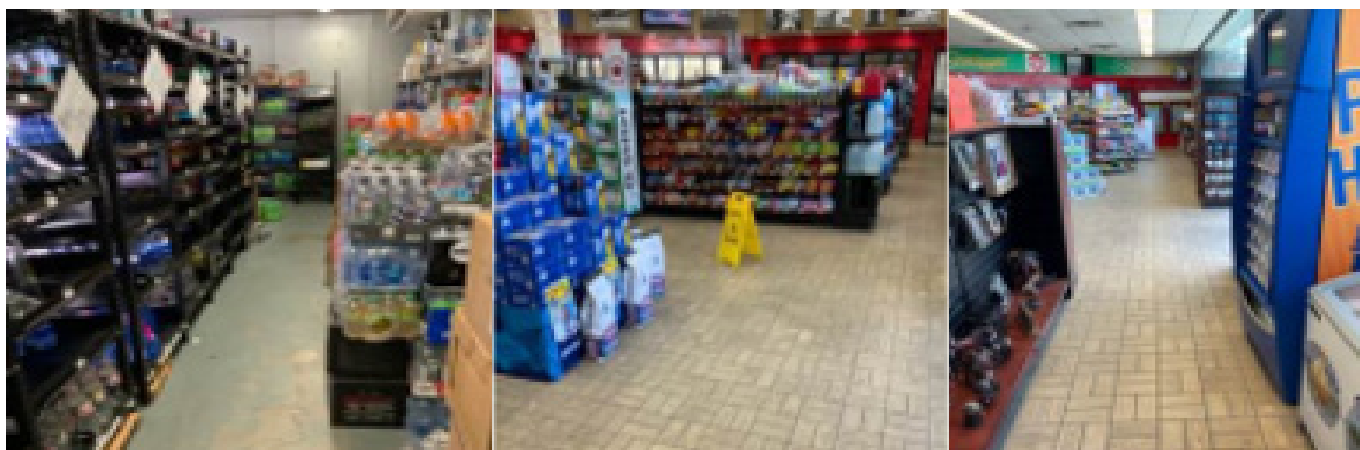

SAFETY NEWS

Safety action of the week – How-to use a Fire Extinguisher

1. Know the location of you fire extinguishers!

During a moment of panic would be a difficult time to locate the fire extinguishers in your store. Place your eyes on your fire extinguishers to know their locations. There should be a sign visible identifying the location. If no sign is present, please let me know at wrobinson@kentoil.com.

2. Identify a clear exit/escape route

Before operating the fire extinguisher, make sure you have a clear evacuation route. If you cannot put out the fire, you will need to make a safe exit.

3. Stand back

Face the fire and keep your back to the clear exit you earlier identified. You should stay between six and eight feet away from the flames as you prepare to operate the fire extinguisher.

4. Discharge extinguisher

It can be difficult to think clearly during an emergency, so fire safety has a long-standing acronym to help you recall the steps involved in operating your fire extinguisher. Just remember PASS.

5. Keep an eye on things

After the flames appear to be out, continue to watch the fire area to make sure it does not reignite. If the fire does start up again, repeat the PASS process.

How to Properly Use a Fire Extinguisher



While the specifics may vary depending on the model you own, most fire extinguishers operate the same basic way. Stand six to eight feet away from the fire and remember to **PASS**:

Stay safe. Stay covered. Stay clean.

1. Pull the pin at the top to break the tamper seal.

A_{IM}



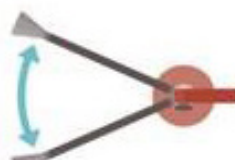
2. Aim the extinguisher low, pointing the nozzle at the base of the fire. Do not aim at the flames themselves.

S_{QUEEZE}



3. Squeeze the handle to release the extinguishing agent.

S_{WEEP}



4. Sweep the extinguisher from side to side, continuing to aim at the base of the fire until it appears to be out.
