For our throw back Thursday here's Michael, who was all packed with water and DC supplies heading out to store 440 in Haskell, 2 years ago, when it first opened!

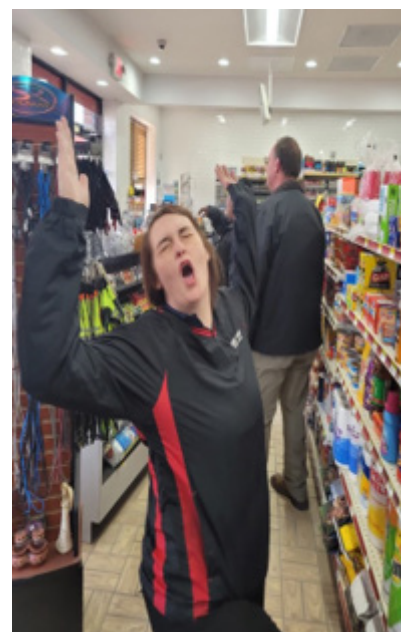

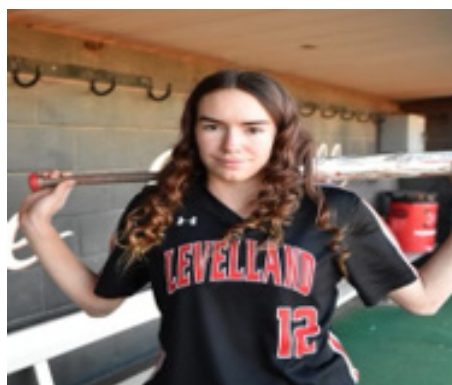

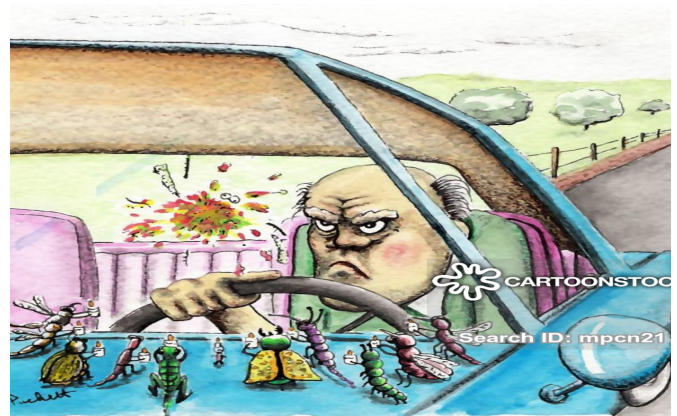

Look for the washer fluid reservoir. On most cars, the washer fluid reservoir is located at the back of the engine bay, near the base of the windshield.

Safety action of the week – Stimulus Check Fraud

Scammers are working overtime to steal your money. These criminals are smart, they know when the funds are being deposited, they know when the checks are being mailed and they know you are anxiously awaiting the payment. The goal of these criminals is to trick you. Do not fall for their scams!

1. **Phishing emails and texts** - FTC advises: The IRS will not contact you by phone, email, text message, or social media with information about your stimulus payment, or to ask you for your Social Security number, bank account, or government benefits debit card account number. Anyone who does is a scammer phishing for your information. Scammers use email or text messages to trick you into giving them your personal information. They may try to steal your passwords, account numbers, or Social Security numbers. If they get that information, they could gain access to your email, bank, or other accounts.
2. **Fake websites** - It is imperative that you do not click on any links in the phishing emails or messages. Doing so can lead you to a fake website that can download malware onto your device and steal your personal information by asking you to fill out a form. Always start at irs.gov/coronavirus to check your eligibility or payment status. Again, NEVER click on links in emails, texts, or social media about this money. Those are scams. Only use irs.gov/coronavirus for official updates and information about your money.
3. **Robocalls** - Scammers may also try to contact you while pretending to be a government official on a robocall, which is a recorded message rather than a live person. Some of these calls might claim you need to pay an up front fee to retrieve your stimulus check or ask you to verify your personal information. You do not need to pay anyone to get your money. Anyone who tells you to pay a fee to get your stimulus payment is a scammer. Hang up the phone.

I hope this information is helpful and prevents you from being a victim. Use your funds wisely and buy local.

Stay safe. Stay aware. Stay clean.
