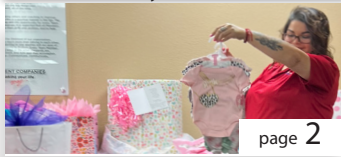

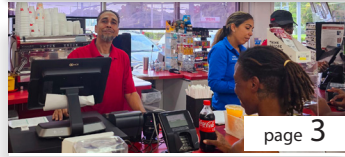

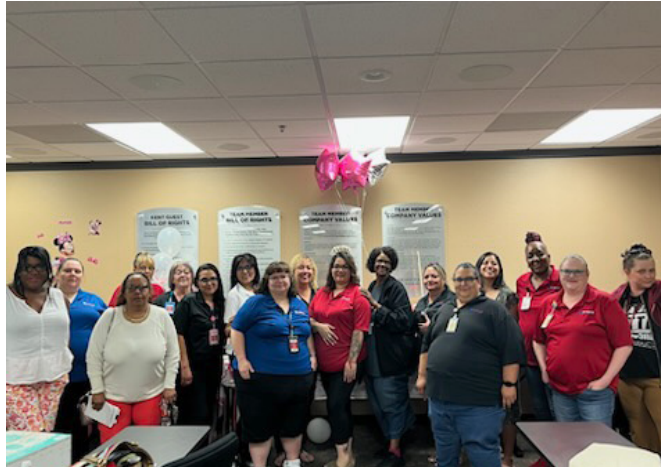


WESTEX NEWS

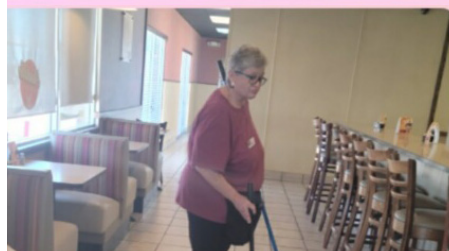

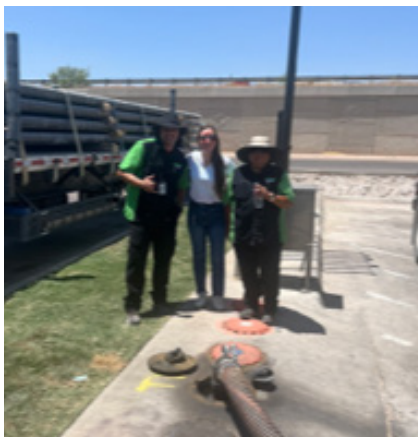
