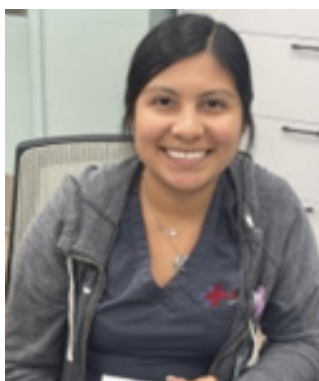

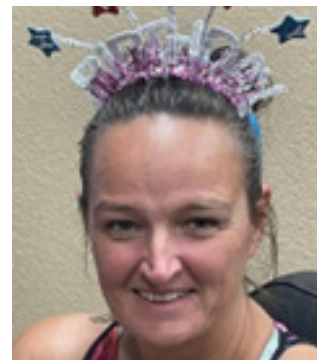

Proper stacking not only safeguards everyone in the vicinity but also promotes an orderly and efficient workspace, reducing the likelihood of disruptions and injuries. Adhering to safety guidelines and regularly assessing stacking practices can help create a secure and pleasant experience for all.

- Proper Staking is Essential.
- Do Not Stack in Front of Electrical Panels.
- Do Not Stack too Tall.
