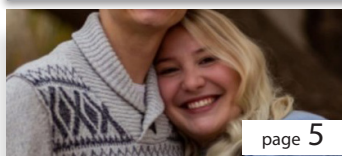

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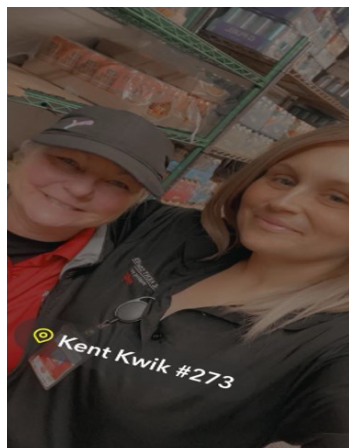


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KENT KWIK NEWS

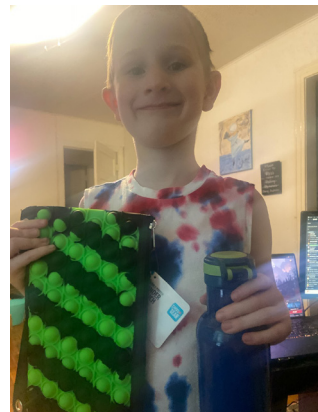

Nothing is too Small!

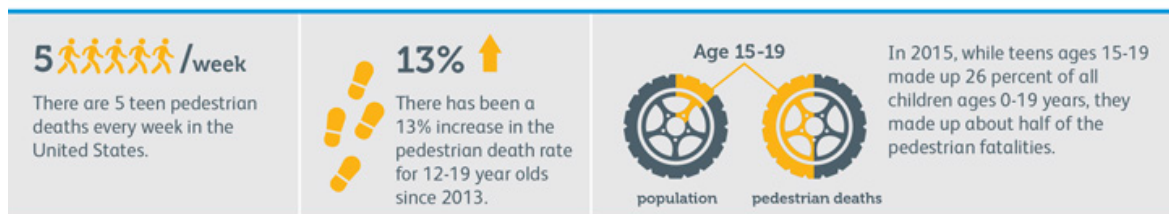
Safety Definition: to ensure safe and healthful working conditions for Team Members by setting and enforcing standards by providing training, outreach, education, and assistance.

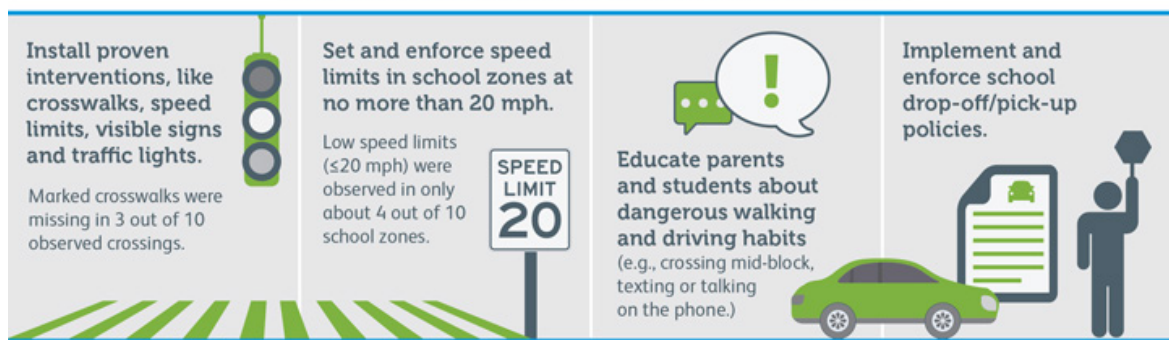

Caroline and her husband, Preston, have been married for two years and have a German Shepherd named Dolly. The rest of their family resides in Tennessee.

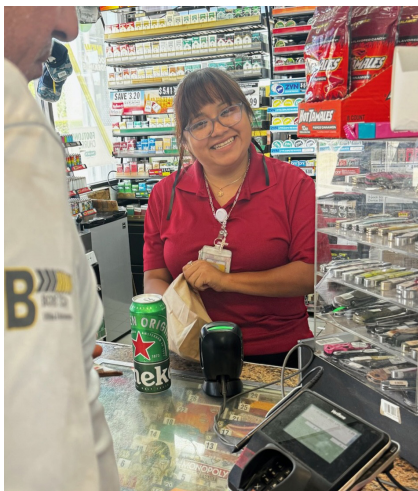

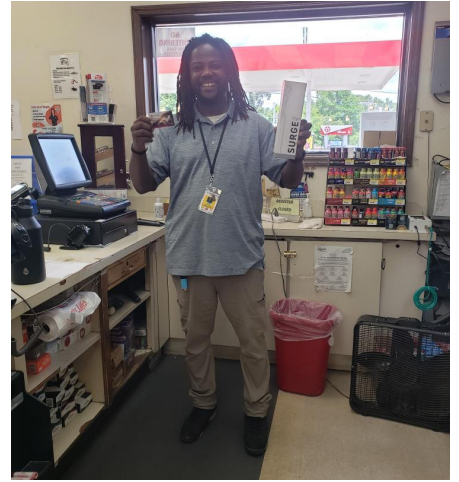
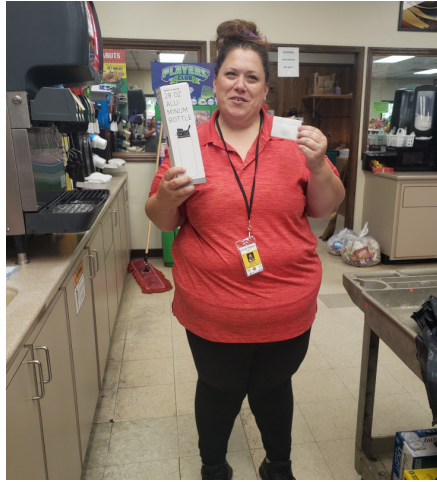
