Heat-related illnesses, such as heat cramps, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke, occur when the body can't cool itself effectively in extreme heat. Symptoms range from muscle cramps and heavy sweating to dizziness, nausea, and confusion. Heat stroke is life-threatening and requires immediate medical attention.

To prevent heat-related illnesses, stay hydrated, wear light clothing, and avoid strenuous activities during peak heat. Take breaks in cool areas and use sunscreen to protect against sunburn. Be especially vigilant with vulnerable groups like the elderly and young children. Recognizing early signs is key to staying safe in hot weather.
