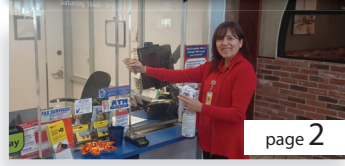

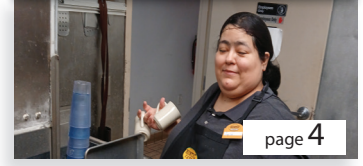

6 Basic Workplace Safety and Health (WSH) Rules to prevent Slips, Trips and Falls

Slips, trips and falls at work can lead to injuries or even death. Every year, more than 3,000 workers are injured due to slips, trips and falls accidents. Do your risk assessment before starting work.

Report to your supervisor if you feel unwell.	Clean up spills immediately.
Always hold the handrail.	Do not get distracted while walking.
Keep walkways well-lit and free of obstructions.	Use non-slip footwear and replace it when worn out.

Please pay close attention to where you are walking and take an active role in keeping our facilities safe. By staying alert, watching for hazards, and addressing unsafe conditions promptly, you help prevent slips, trips, and falls and support a safer environment for everyone.
